What we did in the last 12 months

- Delivery of PMS contract to 20k people
- Creation of EPIC
 - Same day urgent care [SDUC]
 - Development of local Clinical Assessment Service [LCAS]
- Development of Little Hulton Health centre
- Inclusion service
- Supporting PCN's to establish mutual aid

Current challenges

- Pressure in primary care and relationships with the public
- Negative Impact of centralised 'command and control' management
- Increasing demand not matched by resources (finance, people, resilience)
- Uncertainty in relation to transition from CCG to Integrated Care System governance
- Immediate winter planning and pandemic recovery
- Predicted 20%-50% increase in winter care demands
- Unprecedented exodus of workforce from the service at time of greatest need.

New paradigm

- New relationship required between SPCT and its members – improved communication and engagement
- Openness and transparency is key
- Changing SPCT's Articles is a positive step towards managing together the unprecedented times we are experiencing
- The future is looking difficult but together we can build something special
